

History

The listed Schiffmeisterhaus is one of the oldest town houses in Deggendorf. Its building substance dates back to the Middle Ages. It received its current form in the 18th century.



Schiffmeisterhaus around 1920



Deggendorf's Schiffmeisterhaus used to be a traffic hub for ships on the river Danube. Historians verified that between 1643 and 1851, the house was continually inhabited by Schiffmeister (captains who owned their ships), who organized the transport of goods on the Danube.

Location of Schiffmeisterhaus in 1828

During that period, the loft of Schiffmeisterhaus was used to store goods, mainly salt and grain.

Usage

Since 2008, the building has been open to the public and used as a center for information, exhibitions and events. Apart from information about the house itself, visitors can also enjoy annually changing exhibitions.

The attic, with the historical woodwork, can host cultural events and conferences with up to 70 participants.
